As HSCL Coordinator, Brenda also works closely with the other two strands of Tusla Educational Support Services, Educational Welfare Officers (EWO) and personnel from the School Completion Programme (SCP). As part of her work, the HSCL Coordinator regularly meets parents during home visits, at courses for parents in the school and at other school activities and events.
